Principal's Report - David Russell

On Monday May 12th, the Premier of Victoria held a press conference regarding the restrictions in place due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic in relation to schools. As we now all know, Monday 25th May is a pupil free day. On Tuesday 26th May, year 11 and 12 students return to school. This will include Year 10 students who are studying a VCE Unit 1 subject. These Year 10 students are only required to attend onsite for that particular class for the next two weeks. At this time and for the following two weeks, students in Year 7-10 will continue with the online remote learning environment that has been in place for Term Two. All procedures will remain the same under the directive that 'all students who can learn at home must learn at home.'

On Tuesday 9th June, all remaining students (Year 7-10) will return to onsite learning. Students in Year 10, 11 and 12 have been advised of the changes to arrangements that will be in place on their return to school. Students in Year 7-9 will receive this information in the week before they return, as this will include any adjustments we have deemed necessary after the initial two week period where Year 11 and 12 students have been in attendance. As always, I will update the school community as changes come to hand.

As the various year levels transition back to onsite face to face learning, it is timely to note that once a respective year level returns to this form of learning then students are expected to attend. The remote/online learning, in its current format, will no longer be delivered.

I would also appreciate you reiterating to your child(ren) that it is their responsibility in regards to social distancing when not in class. In particular, if engaging in activities of a physical nature during breaks, for example recess and lunchtime, the general physical byplay that has been acceptable in the past is not acceptable in the current environment.

I again thank you for the support of the teaching staff and your children through this unprecedented time.

IT issues

Our IT team, led by Mr Luke Bayley, have worked extremely hard supporting students, parents and staff through this online/remote learning period. This has included issuing loan devices, internet access issues, addressing Compass problems for parents, general IT advice and problem solving.

Junior School Report

We have received the very welcome news that students will begin a staggered return to school. For our Junior School students, their first day back and the resumption of face-to-face teaching will be on Tuesday 9th June. We are currently working on the arrangements that will be put into place to support the health and safety of all students and staff when we return to on-site teaching and learning. You will receive further information about this in the week beginning 1st June.

It was lovely to catch up with many of the Year 7 students at Immunisation Day on Friday 22nd May. Most are very keen to return to school. Now is a good time to put in place routines and structures that will help make the transition back to school smoother. Simple things like starting to get up a bit earlier, making lunches and recording schoolwork in the organiser, are all ways that students can prepare for the return to school.

National Reconciliation Week (NRW) is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia. NRW runs from 27^{th} June -3^{rd} June and the theme for this year is 'In this together'. Students will be participating in activities that have been organised by Katrina Amon. Katrina is a Koorie leader, both at the college and in the local Kingston area and we are very fortunate to have her guiding our learning and understanding of Aboriginal history and culture.

Senior School Report

We're very excited to be welcoming back our Year 11 and 12 students (and year 10s completing a unit 1 subject) this week. There will be many mixed feelings about the return to school, and it important that students read the letter sent last week which outlines the arrangements that have been made for the return to school. Importantly, the senior centre has been set up and the flow of movement established to maintain social distancing as much as possible. Tutor group will run as normal from Tuesday 23rd May and there will be no further remote learning attendance form distributed. Signing in and out will still be done with Kelly in the Senior Centre, with appropriate measures in place for maintaining the required 1.5m distance and a hand sanitisation station.

Importantly, the Minister for Education, James Merlino, announced on Thursday the schedule for end of year VCE examinations and the GAT. Written examinations will occur earlier than previously announced and will begin November 9th and be completed by December 2nd. Performance and language oral examinations will be held October 12th – November 8th. This schedule means that results will be available by the end of the year and tertiary education offers will be made for the beginning of the 2021 academic year. The GAT will be held September 9th, and further advice on this will be provided closer to the time. This is great news for our students and brings some certainty around the end of year.

A full examination timetable is expected to be release before the end of the month. Once we have this schedule we will be able to plan the timeline for our year 10 and 11 exams and end-of-year program.

Finally, I'd like to thank all students and parents/carers for the support that has been provided during the period of remote learning. The transition back to school will come with challenges and, as always, if you have any concerns please contact the relevant student managers, wellbeing or other relevant staff at the college.

I was extremely impressed with the student's genuine interest, questions, input and overall presence throughout the excursion.






